

St. Paul Parish Council of Catholic Women (PCCW)

Minutes to the January 9, 2017 Meeting

1. Meeting began at 6:00 p.m. Ann led us in the PCCW prayer. Those Present: Ann Hintz, Sue Lederer, Bernie Sherman, Marsha Hadden-Phillips, Ruth Ann Meyer and Cathy Kaminski.
2. Cathy read the minutes from the October meeting. Sue approved and Ruth Ann seconded with all in favor.
3. Sue gave the Treasurer's Report with a checking balance of \$6,832.08 and savings of \$2,741.87. The report will be filed until audit.
4. Ann passed out different Thank You cards/letters from places we donated to.
5. Kate was not available for a report on SCRIP.
6. Dick Butzen called to ask what the Knights of Columbus owe for their share of the Scholarships. Ann let them know it is \$250. We talked about changing up the scholarship criteria for 2018. Attending mass will be one of the main topics to change. A letter will go out soon to make the students aware of the change. (They will sign in when coming to mass and if going to another church get a bulletin to present. Sue said she would make up a basic point system and e-mail us for approval or our suggestions. This will consist of 100 point system.
7. May 17th will be graduation, so April 30th PCCW/K of C will present the scholarships.
8. Ann said that our Lick Domestic Violence Campaign brought in \$91.89. We donated \$200 to Cap Services.
9. The Fall Vicariate meeting had said that the Marion ceremony is 3rd Thursday in May in Champion, WI. Spring VIC is in Tigerton.
10. Cathy talked about the Bazaar. It went well; \$400 more than last year. The signs have a different start up time. It will be decided at a later date what time we will start. Sue will take care of putting the signs out and bringing them back in after the Bazaar. Cathy sent out Thank Yours to all donators of monies and raffle items. We sold 1,025 raffle tickets in 2016. There will be price changes for the luncheon. The sandwiches will go from \$2.00 to \$2.25; Beverages remain the same (\$1.00); bowl of soup and piece of pie will go from \$2.00 to \$2.50. The sale of Raffle tickets will remain at 6/\$5.00. Looking forward to the 50th annual in 2019. Cathy is looking forward to different ideas for that special year. So far it has been suggested having a Santa; pre-made letter for Santa to fill out and mail to Santa, with an old fashion mail box (Ruth Ann). It was suggested asking Jim Morgan to be our Santa. Also include hot chocolate and a hot dog; and a picture with Santa for a price to be decided. Also there would possibly be winter face painting or tattoos. This would also include bringing back the surprise bags for children.
11. Ann brought up donating towards the parish's new vestments. After a discussion, Sue made out a check for \$387.50 for half of the remaining balance, after a generous \$500 donation from a parishioner. Ruth Ann made the motion to pay half and challenge KC's to pay the other half. Ann seconded it and all were in favor.
12. Ruth Ann brought up having the Valentine Soup Supper. After a discussion it was decided to table the event until next year because of the new Mass schedule. We talked about doing something as a PCCW group on the 21st of February. Possibly out to eat and a movie depending on the weather. If weather would be bad we will only eat at Buddha's with a social hour from 5:00 p.m. - 6:00 p.m. with dinner at 6:00 p.m. It will be St .Paul's Ladies Night Out with Dutch treat and order off the menu.
13. Marsha brought up the kitchen cleaning to be done. After discussing it, it was decided to set the date at January 26th, starting at 4:30 p.m. or sooner. If needed, we set February 2nd to finish up. There will be a pizza furnished, Ruth Ann will supply a dessert, and Marsha will bring a salad.

14. Bobbi Jo Ebben asked if there was something needed in the kitchen as the Festival Committee would like to donate. Dish towels were brought up.
