Knights of Columbus, Assembly 1862 Minutes of July 19, 2014

1. The meeting was called to order at 7:10 p.m. by Faithful Navigator John Fulcher at the Schueller's Great Expectations restaurant in the City of Waupaca. FN John Fulcher led the prayer for our meal.
2. The roll of officers was called and noted as follows:
